


# 2008 HUD PD&R Fellows Program and Intern Program

# 2008 HUD PD&R Fellows Program and Intern Program

- **HUD's Office of Policy Development and Research is responsible for gathering and publishing current information on housing needs, market conditions, policies, and existing programs, as well as conducting research on priority housing and community development issues. The Office provides reliable and objective data and analysis that informs policy decisions. PD&R is committed to involving a greater diversity of perspectives, approaches, and methods in HUD research.**

Those selected for the Fellows program will work on, learn from, and contribute to projects with current PD&R staff who perform policy analysis/evaluations and conduct research surveys and studies that assist the Secretary and other principal staff in making informed decisions on HUD policies, programs, and budget and legislative proposals. After six months of on-the-job training, Fellows will be given the opportunity to rotate through other program areas within PD&R. Fellowship appointments are for two years. Successfully completed internships can lead to the offer of a permanent government position.

PD&R's intern program is open to college-level juniors, seniors, and graduate students. Interns will work for PD&R at HUD headquarters in Washington, DC, or in HUD Field Offices. Depending on budget limitations, students may

return annually to work in various positions and offices and may rotate between PD&R offices.

## Qualifications

For all positions, candidates' academic work and degrees must be compatible with or closely related to PD&R's mission ([www.huduser.org](http://www.huduser.org)). Grade levels will be based on candidates' qualifications.



- **Doctoral Fellows program**  
candidates must have completed a master's degree or equivalent higher-level graduate education augmented by one year of progressively higher-level graduate education leading to a Ph.D. or equivalent doctoral degree. Eighteen hours is the standard equivalent of one year of graduate study. Entry level for these positions is GS-11.
- **Masters Fellows program**  
candidates must have completed all requirements for a masters

degree in a specialty or field relevant to the work of PD&R. Entry level for these positions is GS-9.

- **Field Economist Internship**  
candidates must have completed a full four-year course of study in an accredited college or university leading to a bachelor's or higher degree that included at least 21 semester hours in economics and three semester hours in statistics, accounting, or calculus. Entry level for these positions is GS-5.
- **PD&R Intern program** candidates must have completed credits at an accredited college or university leading to a bachelor's degree. Entry level for these positions is GS-3.
